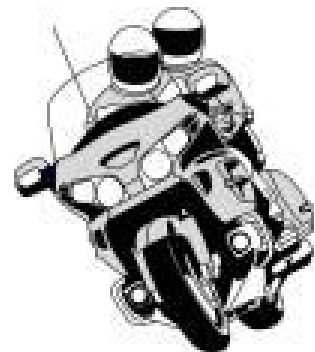

GWRRA MEDIC FIRST AID

Overview of Cold Injuries

Cold injuries which include hypothermia, frostnip, chilblains, immersion foot, and frostbite.

- Hypothermia: a dangerously low body temperature.
- Frostnip: a cold injury where the chilled areas of skin become numb, swollen, and red.
- Immersion Foot: a cold injury that develops when a foot is kept in wet, cold socks and boots for several days.
- Chilblains: an uncommon reaction that may occur with repeated exposure to cold. Symptoms include itching, pain, redness, swelling, and, in rare cases, discolored areas or blisters on the affected area (usually the leg or fingers).
- Frostbite: a cold injury in which an area of the body is frozen.

The normal body temperature of about 98.6° F (or 37°C) is necessary for proper functioning of all the cells and tissues in the body. The skin and the tissues under it are kept at this constant temperature by the circulating blood and other mechanisms. The blood gets its heat mainly from the energy given off by cells when they burn (metabolize) food—a process that requires a steady supply of food and oxygen. A person with a low body temperature, risks having most of their organs, especially the heart and brain, become sluggish and eventually stop working.

A person's body temperature falls when they are exposed to colder surroundings. In response to this fall in temperature, the body has several protective mechanisms in place to generate additional heat. Shivering is one example of the body trying to produce additional heat. Additionally, the small blood vessels in the skin narrow (constrict), forcing more blood to vital organs, such as the heart and brain. However, as less warm blood reaches the skin, body parts such as the fingers, toes, ears, and nose cool more rapidly. If body temperature falls much below about 88° F (about 31° C), these protective mechanisms stop working, and the body cannot warm itself. If the body temperature falls below 83° F (about 28° C), death is likely.

The risk of cold injuries increases when the flow of blood is too slow, when food intake is inadequate, or when insufficient oxygen is available, as occurs at high altitudes. Cold injuries are less likely to occur, even in extremely cold weather, if the skin, fingers, toes, ears, and nose are well protected. To keep warm in a cold environment layer your clothing. Wool or synthetics such as polypropylene are preferred, because these materials insulate even when wet. Your body loses a large amount of heat from the head, so a warm hat is essential. Eating enough food and drinking enough fluids (particularly warm fluids) also help. As food provides the fuel to be burned, and warm fluids directly provide heat and prevent dehydration. Alcohol should be avoided, because the alcohol widens (dilates) blood vessels in the skin, making the body feel temporarily warm but actually causes greater heat loss.

Push Here to Save a Life



IN MY SADDLEBAGS

"300 : 29 : 1"

A recent safety topic "300 : 29 : 1" for all the Fort Zumwalt school bus drivers, and my involvement this past weekend in the newly authorized GWRRA supplement to the MSF Perceptions seminar, got me to thinking about the correlation between the two items; how we see things while driving/riding (our perception), and the statistical possible outcomes.

"300 : 29 : 1" is a statistical measurement of safety. Statistically speaking, for every 300 "unsafe acts" a person displays while driving/riding, said person will cause 29 "minor incidents" to the drivers around them, and for every 29 "minor incidents" initiated, 1 "major accident" will occur.

The MSF Perceptions seminar shows us how our activities and actions on and off the road, affect what we actually perceive through our eyes; in other words, how our brain affects our eyes input. Knowing how it affects you, can also give us insight in how others might be affected by the same phenomenon, and how they will be perceiving us and our motorcycles.

Remember the three parts of Total Braking Distance: Perception, Reaction and Physical Braking? Perception of an unsafe situation is a big part of the very first activity which must occur. If that is being adversely affected, based on misinformation from our brains, then our total braking distance is being affected. How about all the other drivers around us all the time?

If you see someone performing an unsafe act while driving, how do you know if statistically speaking they committing "unsafe act" number 10 or 300? Think about it! Check out the new MSF Perceptions seminar when you get the chance. It will probably be offered at the Branson Convention this year. You won't be disappointed!

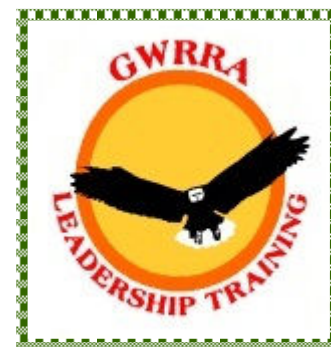

(These suggestions were compiled after many discussions in Couple of the Year seminars over a 3-year period and then were prioritized by seminar participant. They are presented in their order of importance as determined by those members.)

2. Visitation with other Chapters by the Chapter Couple of the Year can increase inter-Chapter activities and improve relationships with other Chapters.

3. Chapter spirit can increase when Chapter Participants show support and demonstrate their pride for their Chapter Couple of the Year.

4. Selection as Chapter Couple of the Year often leads to personal growth for the couple, and they usually take on more responsibility in leadership positions.

5. The Chapter Couple of the Year can bring more awareness within the community about our association which ultimately leads to new Members. Wearing a shirt or vest with their Couple of the Year designation often causes others to ask about the title. News articles about them and public appearances by them can also bring awareness.

6. Through participation in the District Selection Process, a Chapter Couple of the Year can help gain recognition for your Chapter within the District.

7. As your Chapter Couple of the Year visits other Chapters, Couples of the Year from those other Chapters will, in turn, visit your Chapter and probably bring others with them. Increased visitation translates into several positive things including increased revenue for your Chapter through 50/50 sales or other means.

8. Your Chapter Couple of the Year can promote your Chapter's upcoming events as they visit other Chapters.

9. Chapter Couples of the Year can, and often do, provide support to their Chapter through Recruiting and Retention efforts such as contacting potential Members and those about-to-expire. It's a natural activity since the honored couple is likely to be enthusiastic about GWRRA and their Chapter, and eager to "spread the word".

10. With the excitement and enthusiasm usually exhibited by Chapter Couples of the Year, they often are found serving as cheerleaders for the Chapter Team and can be important in maintaining strong Chapter morale.
